## Si Necesita Copias de Documentos

### Documentación de Ingresos

Cuando necesita un W2 o 1099, su mejor opción es pedir a su empleador un reemplazo. Si esto no es una opción, necesita: 1) ir a [www.irs.gov/Spanish/Ordenar-transcripcion](http://www.irs.gov/Spanish/Ordenar-transcripcion) para pedir una Transcripción de Salarios e Ingresos; y 2) vaya en persona a la oficina local del Departamento de Hacienda de Oregón para pedir una declaración de salarios. Lleve los dos al sitio de impuestos.

### Declaraciones de Impuestos Federales

Comuníquese con el IRS para pedir una Transcripción de la Declaración. Una transcripción tiene la misma información que la declaración de impuestos, pero no es una copia de la declaración. Puede ir a [www.irs.gov/Spanish/Ordenar-transcripcion](http://www.irs.gov/Spanish/Ordenar-transcripcion) para pedirla o llamar a 1-800-908-9946. La transcripción está disponible para el año en curso y hasta 3 años atrás.

Si necesita una Transcripción de un año tributario más viejo, necesitará completar el Formulario 4506-T (en inglés).

### Declaraciones de Impuestos Estatales

Escriba al Departamento de Hacienda de Oregón en Salem (955 Center Street NE, Salem OR 97301-2555). Asegúrese de incluir lo siguiente en su solicitud: El nombre (o los nombres); la dirección que están escritos en su declaración; Su dirección actual; El año o los años tributarios que necesita; SSN o ITIN; la(s) firma(s) de la(s) persona(s) que presentó la declaración; \$4 por cada declaración solicitud

### Servicios de ITIN

Le podemos ayudar en aplicar por un ITIN nuevo, o renovar un ITIN que se expiró. Posiblemente necesita renovar su ITIN si los dígitos en el medio son 70 – 82 (EG, 9XX-78-XXXX), o si no fue utilizado en una declaración de impuestos en los últimos tres años.

## Tarjeta de Seguro Social

Vaya a <https://ssa.gov/espanol>, llame al número gratuito 1-800-772-1213, o visite una oficina de Seguro Social para solicitar una tarjeta de reemplazo. La oficina más cerca está en 1538 SW Yamhill St, Portland, OR 97205. La tarjeta tardará hasta 7-10 días para llegar. O traiga el recibo después de solicitar el reemplazo.

## Impuesto de Artes (Arts Tax) de Portland

El impuesto es de \$35 y aplica a todos los residentes de la Ciudad de Portland que tienen 18 años o más con ingresos en alguna medida. Si los ingresos totales de su unidad familiar están por debajo del nivel federal de pobreza, puede solicitar una exención. 
## Check the Status of Your Refund

Refunds may take 7-21 business days if your requested direct deposit, or 3-4 weeks for a paper check.

## Requesting Copies of Documents

### Income Records

To replace a W2 or 1099, first contact your employer or payor. If this doesn't work, then contact: 1) the IRS to request an Income and Wage Transcript (online at [www.irs.gov](http://www.irs.gov), or by calling 1-800-908-9946; and 2) you will also need to go to the Oregon Department of Revenue local office in person and request a wage statement.

### Federal Tax Returns

Contact the IRS to request a Return Transcript. A transcript contains all the information from a tax return, but is not an actual copy of the return. You can do this online at [www.irs.gov](http://www.irs.gov) (search for "transcripts" on [irs.gov](http://irs.gov) and follow instructions), or by calling 1-800-908-9946. This is available for the most recent 3 years only.

If you need a transcript for an older tax year, you'll need to complete Form 4506-T, which you can download at [www.irs.gov](http://www.irs.gov).

### State Tax Returns

Write to the Oregon Dept. of Revenue (955 Center Street NE, Salem OR 97301-2555). Be sure to include the following in your request: Name(s); Address on your return; current address; Tax Year you need; SSN or ITIN; signature (and your spouses if applicable); \$4 for each return ordered.

### ITIN Number

Call the IRS' ITIN unit at 1-800-908-9982

### ITIN Services

We can help you apply for a new ITIN, or renew an expired ITIN. You may need to renew your ITIN if the middle digits are 70 – 82 (EG, 9XX-78-XXXX), or if it wasn't used on a tax return in the last three years.

## Social Security Card

Go to SSA.gov, call 1-800-772-1213, or visit an office for a replacement card. The closest office is at 1538 SW Yamhill St, Portland, OR 97205. Alternatively, visit SSA.gov and create an account. Print out a copy of your overview or show it to us online. It will show the last 4 digits of your Social Security number.

## Portland Arts Tax

This \$35 tax applies to all City of Portland residents 18 or older with any income. If your household income is below the federal poverty level, you may ask for an exemption. 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## **I don't owe the tax . . .**

- Does the IRS think you owe them money that you don't agree with?
- Did the IRS assess penalties that you don't agree with?
- Does the IRS think you earned more income than you did?
- Did the IRS not count your federal tax withholding?
- Is it your ex-spouse's debt?
- We can help you sort out the mess and get the refund you are entitled to.

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## **I can't pay the tax . . . .**

- Do you owe a lot of back taxes but just can't pay?

We can help you apply for:

**Offer In Compromise (OIC)** - This is an offer to pay the IRS less than you owe based on your collection potential.

**Currently Not Collectible (CNC)** - Your IRS debt stays in place until it expires (10 years from the date of assessment) but the IRS agrees not to collect it from you temporarily because of your current financial hardship. IRS will continue to offset re-funds to pay the tax debt.

**Installment Agreement (IA)** - In most cases, the IRS will allow you to pay off the balance in 72 months. We can help set this up and also get the necessary info to request additional time to pay off the balance.

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## **I didn't get the refund . . . .**

- Were you expecting a larger refund than you received?
- Is the IRS auditing your return?
- Did your ex-spouse claim the kids even though the kids live with you?
- Do you keep getting letters from the IRS that you don't understand?

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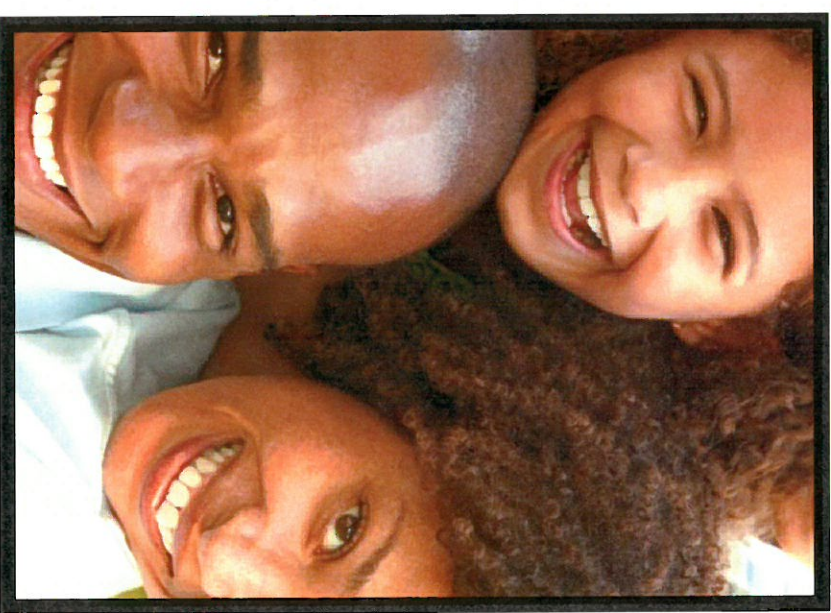

# Do I Qualify for EITC?



## Step One: Answer All of the Following Questions

1. Will you and your spouse, if filing a joint return, have a social security number that is valid for employment by the due date of your return (including extensions)?
2. Are you filing as single, head of household, or married filing jointly?
3. Have you been a U.S. citizen or resident alien all year?
4. Do you NOT file for foreign earned income credit (Form 2555 or Form 2555-EZ)?
5. Is your investment income less than \$3500? (generally, this includes interest, dividends, rents, royalties, and capital gains)
6. Do you have earned income for the year?
7. Are you NOT the qualifying child of another filer?

**No**

If you answered **No** to any of the above questions, you cannot file for the **EITC**

**Yes**

If you answered **Yes** to all of the above questions, **continue** to the next step

## Step Two: Do You Have Children?

**No**

**Continue** to Questions 4, 5, and 6 in this Step

**Yes**

Answer Questions 1 through 3d in this Step

1. Does the child have a social security number that is valid for employment and issued before the due date of the return (including extensions)?
2. Are you the only one claiming this child?
3. Does your child pass all four of the following tests?
  - a. **Residency Test.** Your child must have lived with you, or your spouse if you file a joint return, in the United States for more than half of the year.
  - b. **Age Test.** Your child must be younger than 19, or 24 if your child is a full-time student. Also, your child must always be younger than your spouse if you are filing a joint return and is always eligible if permanently and totally disabled.
  - c. **Joint Return Test.** Your child must not have filed a joint return or, if your child filed a joint return, your child and his or her spouse filed only to claim a refund of withheld or estimated taxes and were not otherwise required to file.
  - d. **Relationship Test.** Your child must be your son, daughter, adopted child, stepchild, eligible foster child, brother, sister, half-brother, half-sister, stepbrother, stepsister, or a descendant of any of them.

5. If you are considered married, are you NOT filing a separate return?
6. Have you lived in the United States for more than half a year?

This tool helps you find out your filing status, if your child is a qualifying child, if you are eligible and estimate the amount of the **EITC** you may get.

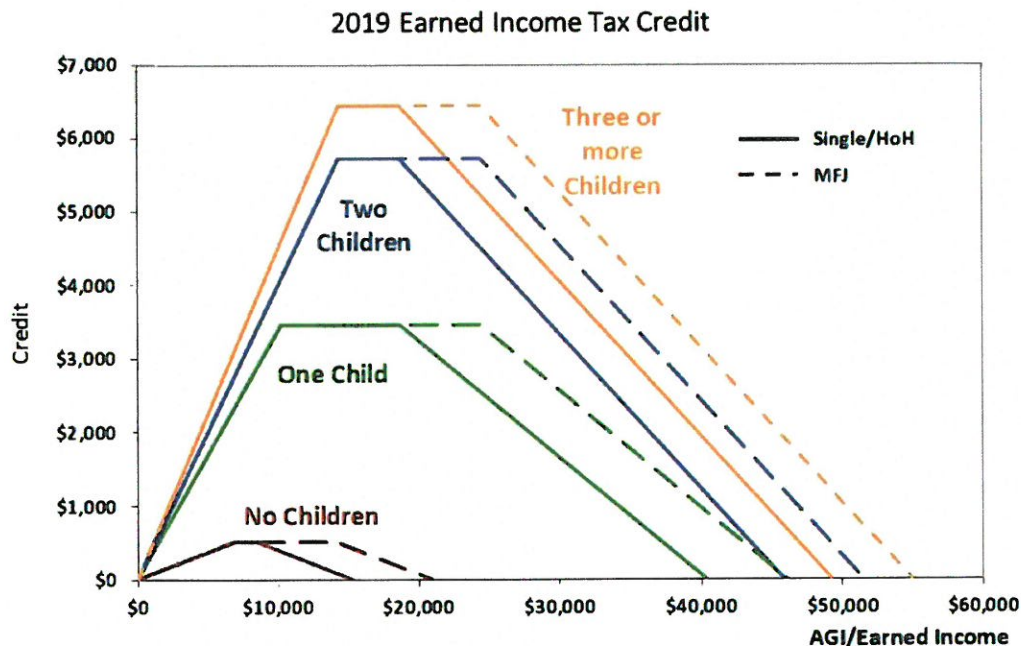
**File Online.** If your household earned less than \$67,000 in 2019 you can file both your federal and state returns for free. **It really is free.**

## What if I didn't make very much money last year - do I still need to file?

**Yes!** You may be eligible for a **Refund!** Even if your income is below the filing threshold, you may qualify to get a refund on taxes paid during the year, or for additional tax credits such as the **Earned Income Tax Credit.**

*You earned it – Claim it!*



The purpose of this chart is to show how the earned income credit changes with AGI/Earned income, number of children and filing status. It is not intended as a scalable reference document.





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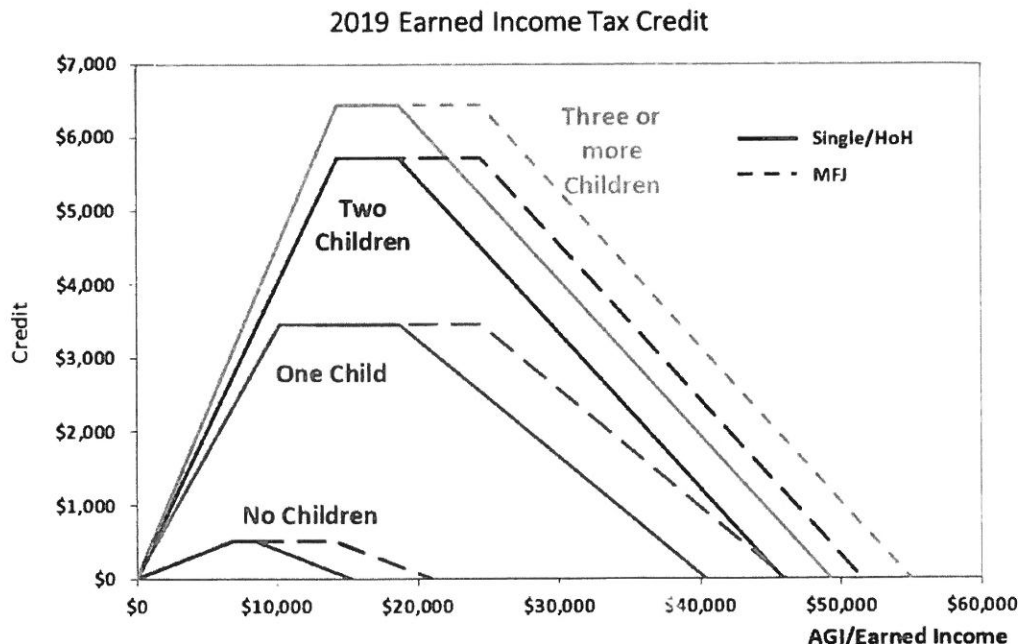
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
